### C. THEMES

# i. Inclusivity in Education

### i.i Issues

### i.ii What can we do about it

Establishing an inclusive education requires relevant stakeholders to focus on developing better policies for the learning process and education. This involves not only improving the curriculum and teaching methods but also ensuring that all students, regardless of their backgrounds or abilities, have access to the necessary resources and support. Additionally, listening to society and leveraging community strengths can provide valuable insights and foster collaboration among educators, parents, and students, leading to more effective and tailored educational strategies. # i.iii Skill development

Students will travel to Jakarta to participate in activities that enhance their understanding of regional cooperation and diplomacy.

 Model AIPA at ASEAN Secretariat: Participants will act as delegates in a Model ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Assembly (AIPA) session. They will debate and discuss key issues facing the ASEAN region, developing their skills in diplomacy, negotiation, and policy-making.

# Day 6: Educational Amazing Race at Taman Mini Indonesia Indah

The final day will feature an educational amazing race at Taman Mini Indonesia Indah, a cultural park in Jakarta that showcases the diversity of Indonesia's cultures.

 Amazing Race Activities: Participants will form teams and compete in a series of challenges that test their knowledge of Indonesian culture, history, and geography. This fun and engaging activity will encourage teamwork, problemsolving, and cultural appreciation.
